Synopsis

Milly McGinty's bedroom is a disaster. When Mum insists that she cleans it up, she discovers that the chaos is hiding, not just the usual dirty socks and rotten potatoes, but also a trio of fantastical creatures. The three baby griffins are half chick and half kitten and Milly has the perfect name for them – chittens. Milly's messy bedroom turns out to be the ideal habitat for the rubbish-eating chittens, but Mum's cleaning frenzy is threatening their environment. With the help of the Department of Conservation, Milly has her room declared a special conservation zone and Mum must leave the mess alone. Now just one more challenge remains. She must overcome her shyness and find a way to win the city-wide talent contest in order to win the money she needs to keep the chittens. Unfortunately, her band is awful. It takes a lot of practise and a little chitten magic to make it to the top.
